2020 SCHOOL BOARD TRUSTEE ELECTION
CALENDAR FOR CANDIDATES

January 13	Board of Trustees calls the Election at the Regular Board Meeting.
January 15	First day to file an application for a place on the ballot including a Campaign Treasurer form.
February 14	Deadline to order a General Election. Last day to file for a Place on the Ballot.
February 18	Last day for Write-In candidate to file
February 19	Last day for the Election to be cancelled if all filing deadlines have passed and each candidate for an office listed on the ballot is unopposed.
February 20	Post and the Notice of Ballot Position Drawing
February 21	Last day for a candidate to withdraw, by submission of a <u>Certificate of Withdrawal</u> or a notarized letter.
February 24	Drawing for Candidate position on the ballot at 8:15 a.m.
March 20	<u>Mandatory Office Hours:</u> Each county clerk, city secretary, or secretary of a governing body (or the person performing duties of a secretary) must keep the office open for election duties at least <u>3 hours</u> each day, during regular office hours, on regular business days. <u>Independent School Districts:</u> A regular business day means a day on which the school district's main business office is regularly open for business. If a school holiday falls on a day during the early voting by personal appearance period that is not a federal or state holiday, the independent school district is still required to be open at least 3 hours to conduct early voting by personal appearance.
March 24	Early voting clerk may begin mailing early voting ballots to applicants as soon as ballots are available, but it is recommended that ballots be mailed no later than the 45 th day before the election, if possible.
April 2	Financial Reports are due to Election Clerk. Last day to Register to Vote. First day of period during which notice of election must be published <u>if method of giving notice is not specified by a law outside the Election Code, and publication is the method of giving notice is selected.</u> <u>Note for Cities and School Districts:</u> Are required to publish their notice in a newspaper. By publishing the notice at least once between the 30th day and the 10th day before the election. Published in the Dallas Morning News with all of Dallas County.
April 27	First day of Early Voting. <u>Note to Independent School Districts:</u> Despite the change in state law that allows an ISD to be closed on school holidays during the mandatory office

hours period, you are required to be open during the entire early voting period except on legal state and national holidays.

April 28 Last day to apply for a Ballot by Mail (**Received not** Postmarked)

April 30 **Financial Reports are due for any additional Contributions/Expenditures**

May 2

Election Day

7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Polls open

7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Voter registrar's office is open

7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Early voting clerk's office is open for early voting activities

7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Sick and disabled persons may vote at the main early voting polling place if electronic voting systems are used at regular polling place(s) on Election Day.

5:00 p.m. -- Deadline for receiving applications for late ballots to be voted by persons who became sick or disabled on or after Thursday, April 28, 2020.

7:00 p.m. -- Deadline for receiving early voting ballots by mail and late ballots cast by voters who became sick or disabled on or after Thursday, April 28, 2020

May 5 First possible day to conduct official local canvass of returns by governing authority of the political subdivision as long as the ballot board has finished processing and counting late and provisional ballots.

May 7 Last day to receive carrier envelopes placed in the mail by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, May 2, 2020, from voters who are voting outside the United States.

May 8 Last day for early voting ballot board to convene to qualify and count any provisional ballots that have been reviewed by the voter registrar and late ballots that were submitted from outside the United States and received by Thursday, May 12, 2016 while the board reconvenes to process provisional ballots.

May 12 Last day for the presiding judge of the early voting ballot board to mail notices of rejected mail ballots to voters.

May 13 Last day to conduct official local canvass of returns by governing authority.

May 25 Last day for presiding judge of the early voting ballot board to mail notices of outcome of provisional ballots to voters.

July 15 **Final Financial Report is due. This reporting includes those who have not received/spent over \$500.00 in order to complete the time for the Campaign**

INSTRUCTIONS

An application to have the name of a candidate placed on the ballot for any general election may not be filed earlier than 30 days before the deadline prescribed by this code for filing the application. An application filed before that day is void. All fields **must** be completed unless specifically marked optional.

The general election filing deadline is 5:00 p.m. 78 days prior to election day for any uniform election date.

NEPOTISM LAW

The candidate must sign this statement indicating his awareness of the nepotism law. The nepotism prohibitions of chapter 573, Government Code, are summarized below:

No officer may appoint, or vote for or confirm the appointment or employment of any person related within the second degree by affinity (marriage) or the third degree by consanguinity (blood) to himself, or to any other member of the governing body or court on which he serves when the compensation of that person is to be paid out of public funds or fees of office. However, nothing in the law prevents the appointment, voting for, or confirmation of anyone who has been continuously employed in the office or employment for the following period prior to the election or appointment of the officer or member related to the employee in the prohibited degree: six months, if the officer or member is elected at the general election for state and county officers.

No candidate may take action to influence an employee of the office to which the candidate is seeking election or an employee or officer of the governmental body to which the candidate is seeking election regarding the appointment or employment of a person related to the candidate in a prohibited degree as noted above. This prohibition does not apply to a candidate's actions with respect to a bona fide class or category of employees or prospective employees.

Examples of relatives within the third degree of consanguinity are as follows:

- (1) First degree: parent, child;
- (2) Second degree: brother, sister, grandparent, grandchild;
- (3) Third degree: great-grandparent, great-grandchild, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece.

These include relatives by blood, half-blood, and legal adoption. Examples of relatives within the second degree of affinity are as follows:

- (1) First degree: spouse, spouse's parent, son-in-law, daughter-in-law;
- (2) Second degree: brother's spouse, sister's spouse, spouse's brother, spouse's sister, spouse's grandparent.

Persons related by affinity (marriage) include spouses of relatives by consanguinity, and, if married, the spouse and the spouse's relatives by consanguinity. These examples are not all inclusive.

²Inclusion of a candidate's VUID is optional. However, many candidates are required to be registered voters in the territory from which the office is elected at the time of the filing deadline. ³This refers to the length of residence inside the district or territory from which the office is elected. For example, length of residence in a school district, for a school trustee office elected at large. This field **MUST BE COMPLETED**.

⁴All oaths, affidavits, or affirmations made within this State may be administered and a certificate of the fact given by a judge, clerk, or commissioner of any court of record, a notary public, a justice of the peace, city secretary (for a city office), and the Secretary of State of Texas.

INSTRUCCIONES

La solicitud para que el nombre de un candidato figure en la boleta para cualquier elección general no deberá registrarse antes de los treinta (30) días previos a la fecha límite para registrar la solicitud, según lo prescribe este código. Cualquier solicitud registrada antes de esa fecha se declarará inválida. Todos los campos **deben ser completados** a menos que se indique específicamente marcados como opcional.

El último día para registrarse es a las 5 de la tarde setenta y ocho (78) días antes del día de la elección en el caso de elecciones uniformes.

LEY SOBRE EL NEPOTISMO

El candidato deberá firmar esta declaración para indicar que tiene conocimiento sobre la ley sobre el nepotismo. A continuación figuran las prohibiciones del nepotismo según el capítulo 573 de Código Gobierno:

Ningún funcionario podrá nombrar, votar por o confirmar el nombramiento o empleo de ninguno de sus parientes en segundo grado por afinidad (matrimonio) o en tercer grado por consanguinidad (sangre), o de los parientes de cualquier otro integrante del cuerpo directivo o tribunal en que el funcionario celebre sesión cuando la compensación para esa persona se pague con fondos públicos u honorarios de su puesto oficial. Sin embargo, la ley no prohíbe el nombramiento, el votar por o la confirmación de ninguna persona que haya trabajado en la oficina de manera continua o el empleo para el siguiente período antes de la elección o el nombramiento del funcionario o miembro emparentado con el empleado en el grado prohibido: seis meses, si el funcionario o miembro se elige en una elección general de funcionarios de estado y condado.

Ningún candidato podrá influir sobre un empleado relacionado al puesto oficial al cual el candidato aspira o un empleado o funcionario del cuerpo fiscal al cual el candidato aspira respecto del nombramiento o el empleo de un pariente del candidato en un grado prohibido según se indica arriba. Esta restricción no se dirige a las acciones de un candidato respecto de una clase o categoría de empleados o posibles empleados de buena fe.

Los ejemplos de parentesco en tercer grado por consanguinidad son los siguientes:

- (1) Primer grado: padre, madre, hijo(a);
- (2) Segundo grado: hermano(a), abuelo(a), nieto(a);
- (3) Tercer grado: bisabuelo(a), bisnieto(a), tío(a), sobrino(a).

Los siguientes incluyen parentescos de consanguinidad, medios hermanos y adopción legal. Los ejemplos de parentescos en segundo grado por afinidad son los siguientes:

- (1) Primer grado: cónyuge, suegro(a), yerno, nuera;
- (2) Segundo grado: cuñado(a), abuelo(a) del cónyuge.

Las personas que están emparentadas por afinidad (matrimonio) incluyen los cónyuges de parientes emparentados por consanguinidad, y, si casados, el cónyuge y los parientes del cónyuge por consanguinidad. No todos estos ejemplos son inclusivos.
